The Workshop to Raise Awareness of Prevent (WRAP) is designed to provide individuals with an awareness of Prevent. Prevent is part of the Governments Counter Terrorism Strategy known as Contest. Prevent aims to prevent people from becoming involved in terrorism or supporting terrorism.

By the end of the workshop participants will be able to:

- Understand Prevent and its aims
- Think about who may be vulnerable to violent extremism and radicalisation
- See why some people are able to influence and manipulate others to commit crimes.
- Recognise when a vulnerable individual may be in need of help.
- Be clear on what help and support looks like in this area, and who you should contact if you have concerns.

Look Say Sing Play

Details:

- Parents interact with their babies all the time without always realising how those interactions shape the way their baby's brain develops. Improving interaction and encouraging parents to be more sensitive to their baby's cues will help parents identify and respond to their needs. It will also improve attunement and sensitivity of parents from an early stage, setting up positive behaviours as their child grows.
- To encourage interaction between parents and their babies, the NSPCC are providing tips for parents to look, say, sing and play with their babies.
- These new brain-building resources are based on the work of Vroom, a US public health initiative that uses the science of early learning to help parents improve back-and-forth interactions with their children.
- This session will talk through the resources available as well as some of the science behind how baby's brains are built.

- The 2016 Safer Later Lives Report states that 'Many of the problems facing older victims are common to all of those experiencing domestic abuse. However, older victims' experiences are often exacerbated by social, cultural and physical factors that require a tailored response.' This can include things like systematic invisibility, longer term dependency issues and generational attitudes making abuse harder to identify.

This performance has been developed to focus on an intimate and personal relationship between an older couple and it is hoped that through telling a story from the victim's perspective, it will help to raise awareness of this topic and demonstrate how domestic abuse has impacted on these fictional characters.
