Section 11 Self Assessment Audit—Deadline is approaching

Section 11 of the Children Act 2004 places duties on a range of organisations and individuals to ensure their functions, and any services that they contract out to others, that they are discharged having regard to the need to safeguard and promote the welfare of children.

Why the KSCP require you to complete a Section 11 Audit?

- Provides an understanding of the effectiveness of safeguarding arrangements and of joint working to protect the children and young people of Kirklees.
- Enables the future KSCP training and support for the Kirklees Partnership to be planned.
- Enable organisations to give evidence of their understanding of safeguarding responsibilities by grading against quality standards and model answers.

When is the deadline?

The deadline was originally the 1st April 2020 but this was extended due to the Covid 19 outbreak. On the 1st July 2020 the audits will be collated and saved so analysis of the themes can start.

What do I need to do? Where Can I find out more information?

The audit is completed completely online using the Enable Audit Tool. If you haven't started the Section 11 Audit you need to register on the system so you can be allocated the audit for completion.

Pennine Domestic Abuse Partnership

From 16th June 2020 PDAP have secured funding to operate a Live Chat facility on their website.

This will allow PDAP to offer a 'low barrier' way for victims (and anyone else) to get immediate support advice and information about domestic abuse, forced marriage and honour abuse and link them to local services that provide domestic abuse support if required.
