- Conference and Core skills courses

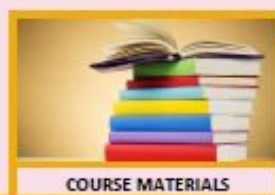

Yorkshire Children Centre Online Domestic Abuse Programme

The Online Domestic Abuse perpetrator programme is a small group programme for up to 8 people per group run over the Microsoft team's platform. There will be 6 sessions covering modules on the following subjects:

- Introduction to what is Domestic Abuse
- Accountability for our Actions
- Role of Gender in Abusive relationships
- Jealousy Isolation and Controlling behaviour
- Negotiation and Non-violent conflict
- Partner blame and Letting go

Either a self-referral or a Professional referral will be accepted.

Following the referral, the following will be undertaken:

Telephone Suitability assessment (30 mins) To assess what the level of risk is !! and to outline terms of use for the remote platform. Also, to check the client has the relevant technology to enable their participation.

Any individuals assessed has **High Risk** will not be accepted onto the 6 week programme with the referrer being advised that a DAPP would be more appropriate stating the reasons why.

6 Group Sessions (1-2 hours duration)

Completion of a Mini Report if requested by the Referrer.

Any Ongoing criminal investigations or offences outstanding is not a barrier to being accepted onto the programme, however any Domestic Abuse related offences that are committed whilst on the programme will result in suspension from the programme.

Also, any sessions missed will result in removal from the programme and these sessions will only be re offered on the next Group Cohort if there is a space available.

Emeritus Professor Jan Horwath— Working with Child Neglect during the Covid 19 Pandemic

Working with cases of child neglect in these difficult times is no mean challenge. The situation is exacerbated by the lack of research and practice experience regarding family behaviour during a period of lockdown. To fill this vacuum, Jan Horwath has drawn on research into child neglect (Horwath, 2007;2013;2019) and makes suggestions as to how neglectful parents and children may respond to lockdown. The analysis below is designed to provide practitioners with some guidance that may prove useful in understanding parental behaviour and establishing the needs of the most vulnerable children experiencing neglect.
