Public committee members bring a different viewpoint to the NIHR committees. The viewpoint of those who most research aims to help (patients, service users, carers, anyone affected by the research topics).

Public committee members join on an equal footing with other members. The usual expectations are to:

 Prepare for committee meetings by reading and assessing meeting papers (such as research applications/proposals)

- Regularly attend and participate in committee meetings (carried out virtually during COVID-19 pandemic)
- Contribute to the discussions and decision-making at committee meetings
- Present written and/or verbal assessments of applications, if required
- Be willing to undertake or attend relevant training, development and support activities offered free by the NIHR
