- Grants to support organisations which connect communities and support communities to work together to respond to Covid-19

2020 Modern Slavery Annual Report

The Modern Slavery Annual Report 2020 has been published earlier today (19 October 2020). The report outlines the progress made by the UK Government to tackle modern slavery and support victims to rebuild their lives over the last year. It also highlights the rapid response to the COVID-19 pandemic to ensure victims are supported and feel safe. The report has been written in collaboration with the Northern Ireland Executive, the Scottish Government and the Welsh Government.

Single Competent Authority Decision Maker recruitment

The Single Competent Authority is currently recruiting over 350 new team members across the UK to increase capacity for NRM decision-making. This will allow us to improve, and maintain, timeliness of these decisions for victims as referrals continue to increase. The roles we are recruiting will include decision-makers, case preparation staff, managers and technical specialists.

Independent Child Trafficking Guardians (ICTG) additional site grant process

As part of the NRM Transformation Programme, we will be progressing the national roll out of Independent Child Trafficking Guardians (ICTGs). Our aim is for this next phase of ICTG rollout to target the areas with the highest need and make the service available to two thirds of all local authorities in England and Wales.

In August, we tested market interest to deliver ICTGs to additional sites, to which we received substantial engagement. **We have today launched a competed grant process to identify the most suitable supplier to deliver the expansion of the service.** Prospective bidders can access this [here](#).

Over the next couple of months, we will be engaging with local authorities to ensure that the expansion of the ICTG service adds as much value as possible to the local safeguarding mechanisms.

Modern Slavery Strategy Implementation Group core meeting

On Tuesday 13 October, Minister Victoria Atkins chaired a quarterly meeting of the Modern Slavery Strategy and Implementation Group (MSSIG). The MSSIG supports implementation of the UK Government's modern slavery agenda through collaboration and engagement between the Government, Devolved Administrations, Non-Governmental Organisations and businesses.

The virtual meeting included a focus on attendees' wide-ranging plans to mark Anti-Slavery Day on Sunday 18 October. In addition, the Home Office presented an update on the NRM Transformation Programme, in particular on plans to pilot devolving NRM decision-making for children to local authorities. The Modern Slavery Unit will be in touch with MSSIG members to arrange the next quarterly meeting.

Sentencing Council consultation for sentencing of modern slavery crimes

The Sentencing Council is the independent body responsible for developing guidelines for the courts to use when passing a sentence. The Council consults and incorporates feedback into proposed guidelines before they come into force.

The Sentencing Council has launched a [public consultation on guidelines for the sentencing of modern slavery offences](#). This consultation seeks views on a draft of the first dedicated sentencing guidelines for offences under the Modern Slavery Act 2015. The consultation is due to close on 15 January 2021.
