A C-Card provides access to free condoms, femidoms, dams, lube and pregnancy tests from different venues across Kirklees. Young people are also provided with information regarding sexual health and other support services.



Partnership Intelligence Portal

- The Partnership Intelligence Portal is designed to offer a simple internet-based portal, to give key strategic partners the opportunity to submit information to a central police triage team.
- It is not designed to replace any current referral mechanisms in place; you must continue as per agreed service level agreements.
- The portal is there to submit the information that is routinely gathered by partners, we are not asking for any additional work on your behalf.
- It is for information about criminality that you feel would be of interest to West Yorkshire Police.

NHS England funded work around culturally competent genetics in Kirklees

NHS England, via the "Equity & Equality: guidance for Local Maternity Systems", made a commitment to roll out culturally competent genetics services for consanguineous couples in eight high need areas - with the focus of this first phase of the work being on the Pakistani community. Kirklees has been identified as one of the eight areas;.

Funding was allocated to the following strands:

Strand 1: raise genetic literacy at community level

Strand 2: educate and equip healthcare professionals

Strand 3: Improve access to genomic services for underserved groups

Strand 4: Continuously improve with national support.

NHS E has developed an e-learning package for Health Professionals to support achievement of Strand 2. There is a generic health professional course, and two profession specific add-on modules that can be completed afterwards by Health Visitors and Midwives. The community based genetic literacy element of the work within Strand 1 will increase awareness at a community level and is likely to result in an increase in conversations with local health care providers around inherited conditions, genetic testing and referrals to the Genetics Service. For this reason, we need as many health professionals as possible to complete this elearning to ensure that the workforce are adequately equipped to respond to any queries, to provide consistent information, to initiate sensitive conversations, and where appropriate to make rapid referrals into genetic services.

Child poverty in northern England 'unprecedented'

Children in the north of England face poverty of a scale and severity which was 'unprecedented', <u>according to the co-chairwoman of a new report by MPs into the cost of living crisis. The All-Party</u> <u>Parliamentary Group (APPG), The Child of the North</u>, says fuel poverty and food insecurity is higher in the north than the rest of England and warned government that rising living costs will lead to immediate and lifelong harms for children, including worsening physical and mental health, undermined education and lower productivity.
